



Nursery – Learning Intention Overview

	Monday	Tuesday
Phonics 10 minutes	When you take your daily exercise outdoors, listen carefully to the sounds around you. Close your eyes and listen. What do you think you can hear? Were you correct?	Have a look out of your window. What can you see? Can you play I spy with your grown up and see if they can guess what you can see. Can you hear the sound that the word begins with? (e.g I spy with my little eye something that begins with t. t,t,t,t,t,t,t, Tree!) You may need some help from your grown up to hear the initial sound.

(2 apples, 2 spoons, 2 stones etc) Can you add 2 and 1? How many are altogether in your group?
