How does learning take place in Nursery?

Your child will learn through structured play and some more formal, short learning sessions. Children are given lots of opportunities to work and explore independently as well as working in groups with their teachers and with friends. Your child will have chance to learn indoors and out every day.

How can I help my child to be 'school ready'?

Talk to your child about how exciting school will be and that it is okay to feel a little nervous to start with! Please help them to be as independent as possible to learn how to do the following:

- Put on and take off their school shoes and socks
 - Put their coat on and fasten it
- Learn how to get dressed and undressed ready for PE
 - Say please and thank you
- Play turn taking games and learn to tidy away
- Go to the toilet independently and wash their hands with soap

How will my child learn at Little Acorns at Pye Green Academy?



All of the staff at Little Acorns at Pye Green Academy are qualified early years practitioners. The nursery follows the 'Statutory framework for the Early Years Foundation Stage' which starts from birth and continues through their time at nursery till the end of their Reception year at school. All of the staff in the nursery are highly skilled in planning and delivering a range of activities for the children. All of these activities are delivered through a balance of child initiated and adult led activities.



The Early Years Foundation Stage (EYFS) is based upon four principles:

A Unique Child

At Pye Green Academy we recognise that all children are unique and all develop at different rates, however we believe that all children are competent learners who can be resilient, capable and confident when they have positive attitudes and dispositions to learning.



Positive Relationships

Children learn to be strong and independent from secure relationships.



During your child's time at nursery we hope to develop caring but professional relationships with the children and their families and encourage positive relationships between the children and their peers. We have a key person policy in place to ensure that these relationships are formed.

Enabling Environments

At Pye Green we recognise that the environment plays a key role in supporting children's learning and development. The nursery environment is designed to allow the children to explore and learn safely. The environment supports the children to become independent and children can choose to move between the indoor and outdoor environment freely.



Learning and Development

At Little Acorns we understand that children develop in different ways and different rates.

The Early Years Foundation Stage has seven areas of learning. All of the areas of learning are equally important and are all interconnected.

There are three Prime areas in the EYFS, these are: • Personal, Social and Emotional Development • Physical Development • Communication and Language

The four specific areas are: • Literacy • Mathematics • Understanding of the world • Expressive Arts and Design



Prime Areas

Personal, Social and Emotional Development

We support children in creating relationships and making friends. We help them to have a positive sense of themselves, develop respect for others and manage their feelings and behaviour. Together we encourage children to have confidence in themselves and their abilities



Physical Development

We provide opportunities for children to be active and develop their co-ordination, movement and control. We support them in negotiating space and handling tools effectively. In nursery we help children to understand the importance of health, physical exercise and staying safe.



Communication and Language

Within our nursery children have the opportunity to experience a rich language environment. Nursery staff have a good understanding of speech and language development and support children in developing their confidence to express themselves. We help them to gain the skills to speak to others and listen with increasing attention.



Specific Areas

Literacy

Books and stories are a very important part of our curriculum. By providing children with access to a wide range of reading materials linked to their interests, they develop a love of reading. At nursery we provide opportunities that encourage children to link sounds and letters to support them in the process of learning to read and write.



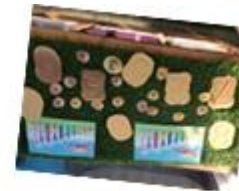
Understanding the World

We support children in making sense of their physical world and their community. We provide opportunities to explore, observe and find out about people, places, technology and the environment.



Mathematics

We provide children with opportunities and experiences that develop their skills in counting, understanding and using numbers. We encourage them to solve problems, including those that include addition and subtraction. In nursery we support children in using everyday language to talk about and describe shapes, spaces and measures.



Expressive Arts and Design

Children in nursery have the opportunity to explore and play with a wide range of media and materials. Opportunities are provided and encouraged for children to share their thoughts, ideas and feelings through a variety of activities in art, music, movement, dance, role-play and design and technology.



Key person

During your child's time at Little Acorns each child and family will be allocated a key worker. This person will be a valuable link into settling your child into nursery and for communication throughout your child's time with us. Your child's Key worker will also be responsible for compiling your child's Learning Journey.



Learning Journeys

We keep a record of your child's progress and achievements. These records are collected through observations of the children throughout their time at nursery and shared with the parents regularly throughout the year. We encourage all parents to be involved in your child's learning journey and welcome your comments, photographs and stories from home. This special book is for you to keep when your child leaves nursery and we hope you treasure it for years to come.
