Pupils Staff Visitors	III Health Incidents	<ul> <li>There are no hazardous or high-risk activities/equipment/plant etc. within the school that would cause fatal or disabling injuries when used as instructed/appropriately. (Activities to be further reduced that could increase risk of accidents during this period).</li> <li>The response time for an ambulance/for persons to reach the hospital is estimated at ?? minutes. (Likelihood of ambulance being sent due to breathing difficulties is increased by calling 999).</li> <li>The school has a sufficient number of first aiders:</li> <li>Children below the age of 24 months; at least one person has a full 12hr Paediatric First Aid Certificate.</li> <li>Children between 2-5 years schools must use their best endeavour's to ensure one person with a full 12hr Paediatric First Aid Certificate is on site when children are present. (If this is not possible, ensure that someone with a current first aid certificate (First Aid at Work, Emergency First Aid or Emergency Paediatric First Aid) is on site at all times.</li> <li>If this is not the case, notify the Trust the School will be covering all children &amp; adults on site by having a member of staff with "a" First Aid qualification on site at all times (not necessarily a Paediatric at Work qualification).</li> </ul>	HIGH		•



			<ul> <li>Regular refresher training is undertaken prior to expiry date by the nominated first aid personnel to ensure competence/knowledge is up to date. (Training expiry dates can be extended by up to 3 months. (Applies to certificates expiring on or after 16.03.2020).</li> <li>A first aid list is displayed in the school</li> <li>First aid kits available.</li> <li>First aid provision is checked on a weekly basis by class teacher and by a nominated person monthly who will record these checks, and any used stock is replenished.</li> <li>A 999 call will be made for any serious injuries that are beyond the capabilities of the trained first aid persons.</li> </ul>		
Insufficient trained First Aiders in an emergency due to number of staff available to be in school as a consequence of self-isolation, illness or an underlying condition.	Pupils Staff Visitors	III Health Incidents	<ul> <li>There is a sufficient number of first aiders to provide first aid treatment for the number of staff and pupils in the school, at all times.</li> <li>There are 3 members of staff who have First Aid at Work.</li> <li>8 staff have Paediatric First Aid (12 hour)</li> <li>1 staff have Emergency First Aid (6 hour)</li> <li>Sufficient first aiders to provide cover for holidays, illness etc.</li> <li>All staff are aware of how to summon first aid assistance.</li> <li>Accident forms are used to record serious incidents.</li> <li>There must be no illegal items in the first aid kits i.e. Aspirin, Paracetamol, creams etc.</li> <li>The EYFS Framework requires a list of staff first aiders to be displayed or staff Paediatric certificates displayed and made available to parents.</li> <li>For additional information regarding EYFS please follow the</li> </ul>	HIGH	•

First Aid – minor treatment	Staff Children	Spread of Infection due to close contact	<ul> <li>Where minor first aid treatment is required First Aiders must ensure they wear gloves and a face covering when dealing with injuries. (Trust Directive)</li> <li>Where possible (age and maturity of child) ask them to wipe away any blood or hold cold compresses etc.</li> <li>Ensure records of injury and treatment are recorded and who administered first aid treatment.</li> <li>No injury slips to be sent home. Verbal correspondents only.</li> <li>Always wash hands after contact</li> <li>All used dressings to be placed in a double bagged closed bin.</li> </ul>	HIGH	
First Aid – Life threatening	Staff Children	Spread of Infection due to close contact	<ul> <li>In the event of a serious injury or incident call 999 immediately.</li> <li>Wear face covering and gloves when in close contact or dealing with bodily fluids (Trust Directive)</li> <li>In the event of CPR being required it is advised only chest compressions are given and use of a defib available.</li> <li>Always wash hands after contact</li> <li>Record all treatment.</li> </ul>	HIGH
