### A report on our recent visit by Hope, Charlie, Jack, Daisy, Shae-Marie, Katelynn and Michael

Year 6 get up to many things. Have you wondered what they are? Read ahead to find out about a particular one!

In the week beginning 9.9.19, we travelled to Laches Wood and for that week completed activities as part of a group.

One student commented: "I really enjoyed spending time with all of my friends and the teachers too. We got up to many things: high ropes, archery, caving, canoeing, search-and-rescue and team games."

Throughout the week, a range of activities were enjoyed including a brilliant day trip when we - the students - went out of Laches Wood and discovered so much about World War One.

On the Wednesday, we went on a trip to the Staffordshire Regimental Museum and the National Memorial Arboretum.

When we got off the coach, the view was extraordinary! There were huge WW1 tanks dotted outside the building and our tour guides were smartly dressed in soldiers' uniforms.

During our time at the museum, we went down into a safely-built trench and learned several battle techniques. We were shown all the different areas in the trench such as The Medical Room; Officer's Room, Periscopes and a box of pigeons!

We were allowed to wear the soldier's gear and hold weapons. We asked fantastic questions and impressed the guides with our well-thought-out facts.

After our exciting trip to the museum, we took a calmer and respectful visit to the Arboretum.

We went to the memorial plaques first to see if we could find the name of the most decorated British soldier. After five minutes of searching, we found it!

The most decorated soldier (who never even fired a single bullet) was William Coltman. He was a medic who saved hundreds of people's lives. He has a memorial by an oak tree which marks his bravery, willingness and caring attitude towards people and his country.

We got to (silently) look at everybody who had been 'Shot At Dawn' (S.A.D.). The youngest soldier was 17 years old.

It was really shocking to see how many people passed away in the wars.

We recommend visiting these places to everyone!
